



- In this manipuraka cakra 10 petalled lotus Mahesvara and Sthirasaudaamini (or Amrutesvara and Amrutesvari) are worshipped with the 52 aapya mayukas

• अनाहत चक्रोपस्थिता: सूर्यकिरणा अथ: प्रसृता स्वाधिष्ठाग्निना दग्धं जगद् आप्लवयंतीत्यागम: aruNaa modhini

Rays of Sun above anaahata, mix with those of Agni in Svaadhishthaana on entering Manipuraka and converted into clouds producing water and cool the world afflicted with tApatrayas.
